All the records of administrative work including accounts, fee, admission is fully computerized and maintained at different levels in the office and information is received, recorded and

retrieved whenever required. Available financial resources are effectively managed by the fully Computerized Accounts Department of the institution. The college follows double entry system for maintaining the accounts, which are of the following three types: • Income and Expenditure •Receipts and Payment Accounts • Balance Sheets. Bio matrix system is used to monitor attendance of faculty. The institution is using computerized finance management software( BUSY). The audit is a regular process without fail, ever since 2008. Online application system for admission. Microsoft Office programme (MS Word, MS Excel, MS Power Point Presentation, etc.) is used to generate the data. CCTV is installed in college building and campus to monitor college and campus activity. Proper audit compliance for better governance for maintaining an effective check on accounts, two types of system are adopted viz. Internal Audit and External Audit former is conducted by Accounts Committee whereas the latter is done by Chartered Accountant at the end of the every academic session. The college has constituted a Purchase Committee and a Maintenance Committee to monitor the use of financial resources in an efficient and effective manner.
